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This course is aimed at non-native speakers of Italian teaching Italian as a Foreign Language, including Italian for Specific Purposes. Teachers of secondary school students, teachers of adults and primary teachers will find the course rewarding.

Objectives

To Improve personal fluency for teaching and to give participants working with Italian the key language and communication skills necessary in educational, social and vocational contexts.

To provide effective training for teachers to better enable them to teach and communicate in Italian confidently and efficiently.

Morning programme: a balanced work on the 4 skills of speaking, listening, reading and writing whilst covering essential grammar, vocabulary, pronunciation and colloquial language. Small groups allow concentrated study of Italian.

Afternoon programme:

- exploring aspects of modern Italian life and culture
- evaluating materials for teaching and learning aspects of culture
- exploring a further range of authentic materials for classroom use
- looking at recent changes and trends in Italy

Intensive Italian Language Topics

Reading Skills...

Reading skills will be developed through reading strategies useful to learn how to get the gist meaning of a text without the interruption of lexical difficulties.

Writing Skills...

Writing skills will be developed more with homework. Students will not constantly use the dictionary in the classroom, giving more importance to communicative efficacy and let the formal accuracy get better with time and experience.

Listening skills...

Listening skills will be developed through a selection of authentic material.

Speaking Skills...

Speaking skills will be developed through both analytical activities and non-guided oral production.

Grammar Awareness...

Grammar awareness will be developed through research-discover strategies, constantly using authentic material.
